## ~ Define Your Own Financial Goals before Teaching Others ~

When it comes to building healthy financial habits, it's often the little things that have the biggest impact.

This was reinforced when I talked with a very nice couple at a recent conference I spoke at in Washington D.C.

Shortly after my presentation, Melinda and Jack approached me and shared how they taught their two sons about money from an early age. "We always tried to share with them our various financial choices," said Melinda. "Whether it was budgeting for monthly expenses like groceries, the mortgage and our utility bills or saving for retirement; we told them what we were doing and why we were doing it."

I asked them how they got to be so comfortable talking about these issues with their boys.

"Before Melinda and I ever talked with the boys about money the two of us had several conversations to make sure we were on the same page," said Jack.

"It wasn't always easy, but we knew it was critical to have some level of agreement about our financial priorities if we were going to have any success teaching our boys," added Melinda.

Almost every week someone asks me *how* and more importantly *when* they should start talking to their children about money. I always answer their question with another question: "How clearly have you defined your own financial goals?"

In order to help another person develop healthy financial habits, it is essential to have a clear idea about your own goals and priorities. You don't have to be a millionaire or know everything about the stock market to be an effective teacher, but you do need a well-defined financial roadmap.

Finally, don't wait for your children to reach the perfect age or procrastinate as you look for the perfect opportunity to wade into the topic. It's unlikely it will ever materialize. My advice: Carpe Diem!



It is much easier to instill healthy financial habits with a young child than it is to unravel unhealthy habits in a young adult. And as I said above you need to have a good understanding of your own financial habits and objectives before you try and teach someone else.

## 2006 Summer Vacation Bible School – Exciting Changes Are

Coming!

Exciting changes are afoot in St. Paul's Vacation Bible School (VBS) programming for this summer! For the fourth year in a row, St. Paul's is partnering with Mizpah United Church of Christ and Hopkins United Methodist Church to offer a Tri-Congregation VBS. That's about all that's staying the same for this year's plans! Following our kick-off on **Sunday, July 23<sup>rd</sup>**, we will be holding a **full day** VBS each day from **Monday, July 24<sup>th</sup> through Friday, July 28<sup>th</sup>** for kids who are going into **first through sixth grades**. For our **4 and 5 year olds**, we will be offering a **half-day program**, Monday through Friday. There will be a minimal charge for each program, with no family turned away for financial difficulties.

That's not all that's changing! Our full day program will be led by the energetic efforts of

three Luther Point Bible Camp (LPBC) counselors, young adults who spend their summers spreading Jesus' love to children through day camp VBS programs like the one we'll be offering. The half-day program will be led by Tri-Congregation volunteers, with opening and closing by the LPBC counselors. All children are welcome to attend the full- and half-day programs – they don't need to be members to come!

**We still need volunteers!** While planning sessions are still on going, we know that we will need many helpers to make this year's VBS programs as successful as they have been in the past. We'll need help with **providing meals** for campers, **assisting the LPBC counselors** with activities, **teaching and leading** the 4 and 5 year olds, **coordinating transportation** for off-site activities, and more. We'll also need at least one **host family** for an LPBC counselor for the week the counselor is in town.

More details will follow in the next newsletter. 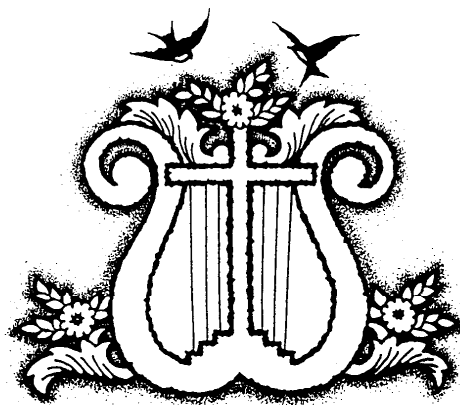

Jordan Long received help from God. It came to him through Lutherans who were equipped to help him with resources that flowed from congregations like yours.

Jordan Long and his family led a normal life in the Sudanese village of Lool Ngugjang—until one night in 1983. “At 4:00 AM we saw fire pouring into our village, located three miles from a larger town that was being attacked,” Long recalls. “We ran away from the village and the fire.”

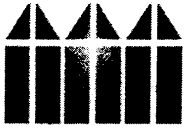
For days Jordan and his family walked, with little food or water. For years they struggled to survive in refugee camps in Ethiopia. In 1989 Jordan was given a scholarship to study in Addis Ababa. Through Mekane Yesus, a partner with the ELCA in the Lutheran World Federation, Jordan renewed the Christian faith he first learned from his mother in their village in the Sudan.

As a result of regular mission support offerings, like the \$500.00 recently given by St Paul’s Evangelical Lutheran Church, Minnetonka, Jordan Long experienced the grace of God in such a powerful way that he felt called to organize a worshipping community, and finally to become an ordained pastor in the ELCA.

Sponsored by Lutherans in the United States, Jordan left the refugee camps to settle in Rochester, New York, where he organized a Sudanese outreach ministry. Assisted by the ELCA’s Division for Ministry, an ELCA seminary, and the Upstate New York Synod, Jordan trained to become an ordained pastor. None of that would have happened without the resources congregations have so generously shared.

Long describes the ELCA as “a solid rock that strengthens my faith journey.” The ELCA, he says, has “enriched, equipped, and empowered me.” Jordan was ordained in October 2005 and now serves Nile Sudanese Lutheran Mission out of Incarnate Word Lutheran Church in Rochester. That ministry provides Sudanese refugees with basic care, an opportunity to pray in their own language, and a mission to welcome everyone in Christ.

Thank you for being a vessel of God’s grace in Jordan’s life, and through him, in the lives of many more who will come to faith in Christ.
